

This October, the annual RIFF festival makes a comeback in Jodhpur, while the cultural splendours of North India and Nepal await your arrival.


If the foodie in you is looking for inspiration, our culinary trails in South India will leave you feeling replete!

Come November, and the Bhutanese get ready to welcome the Black-Necked Cranes to the Phobjikha Valley. Elaborate dances, costumes and processions take place to welcome these beautiful birds as they migrate from the Tibetan Plateau, and come to Phobjikha for their winter roost.

In Bhutanese tradition, these graceful birds symbolise longevity, peace and prosperity and are an important cultural symbol. You may also see images of these cranes painted on homes, as a spiritual motif. In Bhutan, many people believe that the cranes are a reincarnation of their ancestors. According to local legend, when the cranes arrive into the valley, they circle around Gangtey Monastery three times, and do the same when they depart. They are an endangered species and a visit to the Black-Neck Crane Center in Phobjikha tells you the story of their conservation and about their behaviour and habitat. Today, only about 5000 of these birds survive in the wild.

The Black-Neck Crane Festival was created to raise awareness for the protection of the birds and their habitat. It takes place on the 11th of November each year at the Gangtey Gompa in the Phobjikha Valley.
