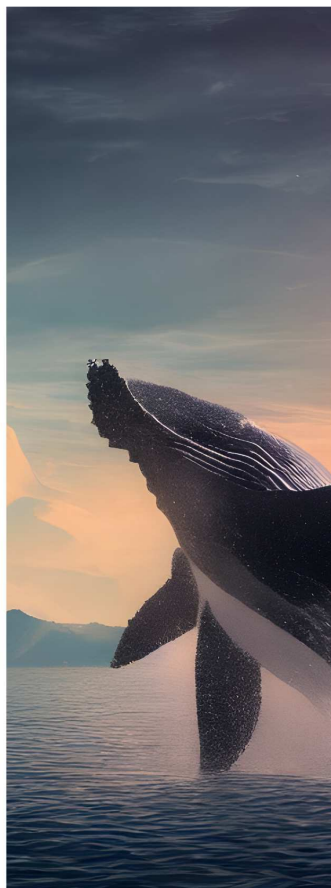
As the monsoon recedes, it leaves behind a lush and verdant subcontinent – the perfect playground for those who love nature and wildlife.
