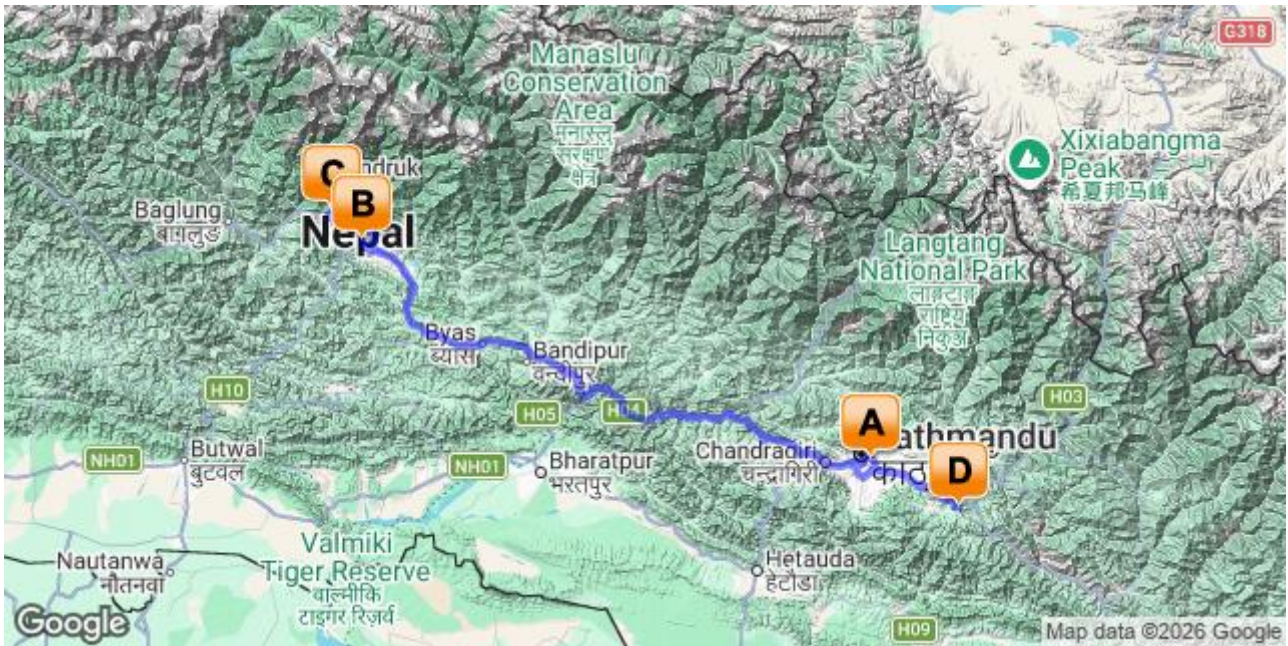

KATHMANDU - SIGHTSEEING

Meals: Breakfast & Dinner

After breakfast at the hotel commence the sightseeing tour of Kathmandu Durbar square, Swyambhunath stupa and Patan Durbar square.

KATHMANDU DURBAR SQUARE

The durbar square with its arrays of temples, courtyards, monuments and the ancient palaces of the former Nepali Royals is located in Basantapur in the heart of Kathmandu city, the country's capital. Chief attractions here include Hanuman Dhoka Royal Palace, the magnificent Taleju Temple towering more than 40 meters; Kumari Ghar, the residence of the Living Goddess, Kumari; the temple of Ashok Vinayak dedicated to lord Ganesh (elephant headed deity), and Kal Bhairav, the God of Wrath. There is a giant pagoda of 'Kasthamandap', a structure which is said to have been built out of a single tree. The name of the capital 'Kathmandu' is said to be actually derived from 'Kasthamandap'.

SWAYAMBHUNATH STUPA

Said to be around 2000 years old, this Buddhist Stupa sits atop a hill. The main stupa is composed of a solid hemisphere of brick and earth supporting a lofty conical spire crowned by a pinnacle of Copper gilt. Painted on the four sided base of the spire are the all-seeing eyes of Lord Buddha. The hill of Swayambhunath is a mosaic of small Chaityas and Pagoda temples. You'll get a scenic view of Kathmandu city from there.

PATAN DURBAR SQUARE

Located 5 km southeast of Kathmandu, the Patan city popularly known as 'the city of artisans' accommodates a magnificent square housing the palace buildings of the then royals, artistic courtyards and graceful pagoda temples – a display of Newari architecture that had reached its pinnacle during the reign of the Malla kings. It is filled with wood and stone carvings, metal statues, and ornate architecture, including dozens of Buddhist and Hindu temples, and over 1200 monuments.

After sightseeing tour drive back to Hotel.

Pokhara

The second-largest city in Nepal, Pokhara sits on the shores of Phewa Lake in the central region of the country. Often called the 'Adventure and Leisure Capital of Nepal', and known as the gateway to the Annapurna Circuit, Pokhara is a popular hub offering plenty to see and do. The range of activities on offer is impressive, with lakes and waterfalls to admire; yoga, reiki, and meditation classes to attend; caves (such as Mahendra) to explore; boating, canoeing, and whitewater rafting on the waterways surrounding the Lake to enjoy; and a number of challenging hikes to test your fitness (the viewpoint of Sarangkot is particularly rewarding). Meanwhile, serious trekkers can access the Annapurna Base Camp from Pokhara, the first stop for a number of stunning trails through the spectacular mountain range.

Day Itinerary

KATHMANDU / POKHARA (BY SURFACE - 210KM/6-7 HRS).

Meals: Breakfast & Dinner

After breakfast drive towards our next destination to Pokhara.

Once you reach in Pokhara, check-in at the hotel.

POKHARA is a remarkable place of natural beauty. At an elevation lower than that of Kathmandu, it has much more tropical feel to it; a fact well appreciated by the beautiful diverse flowers that prosper in this environment. The enchanting city with a population above 250000 has several beautiful lakes and offers stunning panoramic views of the Himalayan peaks. The valleys surrounding Pokhara is home to thick forest, gushing rivers, emerald lakes and of course, the views of world famous Himalayas. The serenity of the lakes and the magnificence of the Himalayas rising behind them create an ambience of peace and magic.

PM: Boat ride at Lake Phewa.

BOATRIDE AT FEWA LAKE

Phewa Lake Boating trip is the handiest refreshment in Pokhara, the second largest lake and is a famous focal point in Pokhara which is perfect for nature lovers and fans of outdoor and water-based activities. Located in the south of the Pokhara Valley, this semi-natural freshwater lake

Covers an area of about 4.43 km² with a dam regulating the water reserves. While the north shore of the lake is teeming with hotels, lodges, restaurants, and bars catering to the travelers, which become one of the best known tourist area of Nepal, commonly called Lakeside, the steep southwestern shore is the fairy world of lush forest and wild birds, making for real nature treks and hikes. There are also many ways to experience the nature beauty of Fewa Lake like walking or cycling around the lakeshore but you will find its best when cruising leisurely over its emerald hued water on one of the brightly painted doongas (boats). The breathtaking taking views of mount Machhapuchhre and other mountain peaks of the Annapurna and Dhaulagiri ranges is awesome.

After boat ride back to Hotel or indulge on your own at Lake side.

EARLY MORNING SUNRISE TOUR TO SARANGKOT

Commence around 05 AM (or guide suggesting) for the sunrise tour to Sarangkot. This place is located 9 kms to the north west of Pokhara and is one of the most popular tourist destinations in Nepal. Conveniently perched high on the top of a ridge at 1,592m., the serene hill resort offers the spectacular panorama of the entire Annapurna range stretching from east to west and the unspoilt rural settlements just below those towering peaks. Viewing 700mts down from the top of Sarangkot you can have awesome sights of the stretching Pokhara Valley, Phewa Lake and many more.

Drive back to the hotels for breakfast. After breakfast commence the sightseeing tour of Pokhara city.

GUPTESHWAR CAVE

The cave is probably the longest and attractive cave in south Asia which is located at a pristine location northwestern part of Pokhara district. Ancestors called this place as desolate Khatri Tara. At that time water steam used to come out from this place and some courageous youngsters used to go inside and catch fishes. In 1970, 1980 and 1982 a British Expedition Organization named British course Research Cave Expedition expatiated this cave and published about it in The Atlas of the Great Caves of the World. This cave is now a religious as well as touristic destination. Hindus visit this cave to worship lord Shiva- the superior god as per Hindu Mythology.

DEVI'S FALLS

Locally known as Patale Chhango (or Hell's fall), Devi's fall is an amazing waterfall lying about 2 km south-west of Pokhara airport on the highway to Tansen. It was named after Devi, a Swiss lady who was swept away when the floodgates were accidentally opened, never to be seen again.

TIBETAN REFUGEE CAMP

Established in 1962, Tashi Palkel is the oldest Tibetan settlement camp in Pokhara. It's located in Pokhara's outskirts, approximately 5km northwest to the town of Hemja. As soon as you enter the camp, you will feel transported to a different world. If you encounter a Tibetan woman selling souvenirs in Pokhara's Lakeside, there's a high chance she is from Tashi Palkel as selling souvenirs is the main source of income for residents of this camp.

INTERNATIONAL MOUNTAIN MUSEUM

The International Mountain Museum (IMM) has a striking exterior. It was built with the goal of recording, documenting, exhibiting, and chronicling the evolution of mountain and mountaineering activities around the world from the beginning to the present. Many mountaineering clubs and associations, as well as individual donors from all over the world, have contributed significantly to its success. The Nepal Mountaineering Association (NMA) established the museum with the theme 'Man, Mountain, and Mountain Activities Around the World.' As a result, the entire museum's display area has been divided along the theme.

The exhibition Halls are:

Hall of Mountain People: This hall exhibits the customs, traditions, heritage, culture and way of life of the mountain people.

Hall of World Mountains: This hall displays geological facts about the origins of world mountain systems as well as all fourteen peaks over 8000 meters. The hall also exhibits and explains the Himalayan flora and fauna. Another feature of the museum is its emphasis on individuals such as Kumar Khadga Bikram Shah (the NMA's founder president), Dr. Toni Hagen (a renowned geologist and lover of Nepal who published the first pictorial "Nepal"), Reverend Ekai Kawaguchi (the first Japanese to visit Nepal in 1899), and Dr. Harka Gurung (Renowned scholar, geographer, development planner and first Tourism Minister of Nepal).

Mountain Activities Hall: This hall is dedicated to mountain activities such as mountaineering and trekking, and it highlights historical ascents and explorations in and around mountainous regions. Surprisingly, it also highlights the advancement of climbing gear and other essential mountaineering equipment.

You can also opt for below adventure activities....

HOT AIR BALLOONING IN POKHARA

Hot air ballooning in Pokhara provides to see the mighty Himalayas. Flying like a bird, seating in wicker, you can explore the magnificent views of Mount Annapurna, Mount Fishtail, Mount Dhaulagiri, Mount Hiunchuli, Lamjung Himal, Mount Manaslu, similarly other peaks.

This 30 to 40 minutes Hot Air Balloon in Pokhara is named Eagle Eye Hot Air Balloon. In this flight, you will fly like an eagle and see the bird's eye view of beautiful Pokhara city. It takes you around Pokhara City and you can enjoy the magnificent views of Mount Fishtail, Mount Dhaulagiri, Mount Annapurna, Mount Hiunchuli, Mount Lamjung Himal, and also the Phewa Lake with the freshness of cold chilly weather. The balloon will rise from the ground up to 1000ft high in the blue sky.

ATV (All-Terrain Vehicle) Adventure is off-road vehicles. When adequate road journeys are inaccessible, these vehicles are used on the route. Get ready for a fantastic four-wheel drive through Sarangkot's rugged pathways,

which will reward you with breathtaking views of Fewa Lake, thrilling off-road tracks through hills and woods, and an overview of the region's rich cultural, historical, and natural history.

The guides are highly knowledgeable and experienced. Therefore, you can have the best of adventure with the ATV's accelerator in your hand. This certainly is one of the most loved and chosen day activities by many tourists. The adventure starts with our representatives taking you to the ATV track's starting point, the guides briefing you and getting ready with an ATV for you to ride. From there, you start on an amazing, adrenaline-popping, and under-ventilating ride with Phewa Lake, Mt. Annapurna, and Mt. Fishtail watching you from every corner and turn.

BUNGEE JUMP

If you are an adventure hunter and want to go for an activity that actually can pump up your heart's race rate, feel the free fall, and flex your strength and mental ability to take risks, bungee jumping in Pokhara is the best thing you can do. With all the safety measures checked, high-quality materials used, and safety briefing before the jump, bungee jumping in Pokhara offers the safest and one of the most adventurous bungee jumping experiences.

Bungee Jumping in Pokhara is a perfect choice for anyone who loves daring adventures. Jumping off an altitude of 80 meters into the gorge will offer you a feeling of risky adventure. With Green Valley Nepal Treks, you get to jump off the only tower bungee jumping in Hemja.

ZIPLINE (ZIP FLYER)

Zipline in Pokhara is one of the most adventurous and adrenaline-rushing activities one can do in this city. Anyone who wants to raise their adrenaline level and get on the highest zip-lining adventure can go for the Zip-lining in Pokhara. Zip Flyer is located in Sarangkot, which is a 30-minute drive from Lakeside and 8 kilometers northwest of Pokhara Valley. The world's tallest, longest, fastest, and steepest zip line is located in Pokhara and spans 1.8 km with 600 meters of vertical drops at a 60-degree slope.

ULTRA LIGHT FLIGHT

Ultralight Flight, is the best choice for people who are interested in flying over the air like birds while taking in the splendor of the Pokhara Valley from above. Ariel sightseeing of the Pokhara valley and the spectacular Himalayas are now both accessible with Ultralight aircraft.

An incredible experience that is spectacular, completely extraordinary, and superior to any other trip is an Ultralight flight. The nearby proximity of the mountain and the beautiful lakes make Pokhara an ideal location for Ultralight aircraft. Pokhara is also suited for ultralight flying because of its shared airspace with Himalayan griffin vultures, eagles, and kites, as well as its amazing views of the gorgeous Himalayas as it flies above towns, monasteries, temples, lakes, and jungle.

PARAGLIDING

Paragliding will be your greatest option if you are thinking about engaging in any challenging and thrilling sports to get over your phobia. In Nepal, paragliding is one of the most popular adventure activities. Your initial paragliding adventure might be started at Pokhara. With mountains, lakes, and beautiful terrain, Pokhara City's surroundings are breathtaking. Pilots who have received international certification are used in paragliding operations. Paragliding in Pokhara shouldn't be missed if you enjoy adventure and are visiting Nepal.

The distinctive topography of Nepal, which includes mountains, hills, rivers, rich vegetation, and more, contributes to a distinctive paragliding experience. With a breathtaking perspective of the gorgeous Himalayas, kites, Himalayan griffin vultures, eagles, and other birds may be seen gliding above villages, monasteries, temples, lakes, and forests at Mountain View.

Dhampus

Dhampus is a small village perched high on a hillside in the Gandaki Zone of northern-central Nepal. This quiet little village serves as a popular overnight stop for trekkers exploring the remarkable mountains of the Annapurna region. The village boasts spectacular views of the Annapurna south peaks and Mt. Machhapuchhare, also known as Fishtail Mountain. Aside from the incredible views, Dhampus offers a wonderfully authentic cultural experience. Visitors are afforded the opportunity to interact with the ethnic Gurung people, who continue to live much as their ancestors have for centuries.

Day Itinerary

POKHARA - DHAMPUS (BY SURFACE - 27KMS/01 HR.).

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

After breakfast at the hotel you will drive to Dhampus which will take approximately 1 hour and is the popular starting point for Annapurna Base camp, Mardi Himal and Australian camp.

Once you reach at Resort followed by check-in procedure.

Lunch at Resort.

Dhampus is one of the most scenic villages in the Annapurna region, and also one of the easiest to reach. Perched above the Pokhara Valley, this peaceful Gurung settlement boasts wide-angle views of Machhapuchhre (Fishtail Mountain) and the mighty Annapurnas, all without requiring a strenuous trek. Sunrise and sunset views from the hilltop would be an amazing experience. Village life experience is the key thing to see during your Dhampus visit.

This magical place is home to the Gurung people, known for their warm hospitality and strong traditions. Visitors can explore the village's daily rhythms from farming and weaving to dance and music, and gain insight into a lifestyle shaped by the mountains.

The weather of Dhampus village is extensively mild and pleasant. The average annual temperature in Dhampus is 16 degrees Celsius and the average rainfall is 3916 mm. The weather is apparent in the spring and autumn season. Autumn (October and November) is the best season to visit Dhampus village. Except for autumn, Spring (March to May) is another best season to visit Dhampus.

Dhampus village is populated by the Gurung community. The villagers practice their ancient culture and traditions. Which are still followed by their new generations. Gurungs are also known as Gurkha, a symbol of bravery. Gurkhas have been serving in India and British army forces from the Second World War.

Dhampus village is a hilly landscape and an evergreen hill with great Himalayas views. At sunrise, you can experience the sculpture, mountain views and the dense forest with colourful wildflowers. This beautifully maintained place offers a panoramic view of the sunset in the evening. Travellers can enjoy the excellent wonder as the colours dance over the top of the Himalayas.

Today you can simply relax at the resort and take in these incredible sights.

DHAMPUS - SIGHTSEEING

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

After breakfast at the resort explore the charming village Dhampus, observing the local culture and lifestyle. Dhampus, a centuries-old rural village inhabited mostly by the Gurung community. The Gurungs (and some Magar families) in this region have a rich cultural heritage, traditionally engaging in farming terraced fields and livestock herding. Many Gurung households follow a blend of Hindu and Buddhist practices, living in harmony as observed in Dhampus.

Walking through Dhampus, visitors will notice traditional stone-and-mud houses with thatched or tin roofs, and villagers in traditional attire working the land much as their ancestors did. Life here moves at a gentle pace: farmers tend to rice, millet, and vegetable plots, and friendly herders can be seen guiding buffalo or goats along the trails.

Dhulikhel

The town of Dhulikhel is set at the far east of the Kathmandu Valley. It's one of the best spots in the country from which to admire the magnificence of these rugged peaks offering phenomenal views of the surroundings. There's plenty more to enjoy here than just views though. This is an authentic Nepalese town where the culture and traditions of the local Newari people have stayed strong. There is a charming old town with two lovely temples in distinct Vishnu and Hari Siddhi styles, and a Kali temple set on a hilltop above the town, from where there are lovely views of Dhulikhel and its surrounds.

Day Itinerary

DRIVE TO POKHARA AIRPORT (1 HR.) FLY BACK TO KATHMANDU (25MIN).

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner

After breakfast at the hotel transfer to domestic airport fly back to Kathmandu.

On arrival meet, assist by our representative and drive to Dhulikhel (1550m/30km/1½ hrs.).

Dhulikhel, a beautiful township throughout the year near Kathmandu Valley, is becoming a growing tourist destination for domestic and international visitors. Dhulikhel is situated just 30-km southeast of Kathmandu. Because of good highway connecting Kathmandu with Dhulikhel, it is very comfortable for travelers to visit this township. Upon reaching at this tourist' beautiful spot visitors still feel away from urban hustle and bustle. One of the attractions of Dhulikhel is that this is a melting pot of a variety of communities such as the Newars, Brahmins, Chhetris, Tamangs and Dalits in Nepal. The historic town houses beautiful old houses and temples too.

Dhulikhel remained an ancient trading centre in between Nepal and Lhasa in for a long time. In the past, the Nepalese people would visit Tibet to bring home gold, while the Tibetans used to come to Kathmandu to buy rice, chilies, salt and other daily consumer goods.

With a favorable climate, visitors can get a unique experience by exploring various villages and scenic spots in and around Dhulikhel. Another attraction of Dhulikhel is that one can have a superb view of mountains, lush green forests and surrounding rural settlements from the city. More than 20 Himalayan peaks, including Mount Annapurna (8091m), Mount Ganesh Himal (7429m), Mount Langtang (7234m), Mount Phuribichyachu (6637m), Mount Gaurishanker (7134m), Mount Lhotse (8516m) can be observed from different points of the city.

Because of the expansion of the community forests in and around Dhulikhel, bird watching and forest walk have now become additional attractions to visitors.

The 1,000 stone-paved ladders and a tall statue of the Lord Buddha in the ever green Shanti Ban near Dhulikhel lure many tourists. The Kali Temple located atop Devasthan hill is another tourist attraction.

Once you reach in Dhulikhel, resort check-in procedure.

Lunch at Resort. After lunch free day, enjoy the panoramic mountains in front of you on the North and Northeast side from the resort.

Catch fabulous sunrise on time as well for breakfast with grand mountain views. After glorious views with time for walk around Dhulikhel town to observe local native Newar village of great artistic skill with streets lined with old brick houses, carved wooden windows, sloping tile roofs, pagoda temples and sacred statues everywhere. You will think you have wandered into a cultural theme park.

Visit major places of worship of Narayan and Hari-Siddhi temples which are adorned with profuse wood carvings, the Gokhureswar Mahadev temple, a 30 minutes' walk to the eastern part of town situated in peaceful scenic spot.

The Bhagwati temple situated on a high hill where one can get marvelous vista of the town with surrounding areas around Dhulikhel hosts many vintage points for super panorama of Himalaya that will keeps you spellbound.

Looking out over low hills and valleys, the mountains rise up in an extended arc stretching from the far left to the far right includes various high Himalayan Peaks.

After breakfast at the Resort we drive back to Kathmandu en-route visit Bhaktapur and Boudhanath stupa.

BHAKTAPUR DURBAR SQUARE

Located 12 km east of Kathmandu, Bhaktapur or Bhadgaon literally meaning 'the City of Devotees' is the smallest city in the Kathmandu valley. Its Main Square or 'Layaku' is famous for the 15th century Palace of 55 Carved Windows with the Golden Gate as a royal entrance. In front of the palace building are innumerable temples and architectural showpieces including the Lion Gate, the statue of King Bhupatindra Malla mounted on a giant stone pillar and the stone temple of Vatsala Devi; another beautiful example of Shikhara-style architecture. There is a bronze bell on the terrace of the temple, which is also known as the Bell of Barking Dogs. This was erected in 1737 by King Ranjit Malla; its sounding announced the beginning and end of a daily curfew.

BOUDHANATH STUPA

One of the oldest and the biggest Buddhist monuments ever built in Nepal; Boudhanath is a spherical stupa structure imposing at a height of 36 meters with three massive Mandala style platforms. Located 08 kilometres east of Kathmandu, the stupa with four pairs of eyes at the four cardinal directions is believed to be keeping watch for righteous behavior and human prosperity.

Built on an octagonal base inset with 108 prayer wheels, the shrine is ringed by the settlement especially of the Tibetan refugees who entered Nepal in the 1950s. They have developed the place into a 'Mini-Tibet' ever since.
